

Four Seasons Hotel


Gym



Sydney Opera House

The Sydney Opera House is one of the most recognizable buildings in the world and the cultural icon of the city. Designed by Danish architect Jørn Utzon and inaugurated in 1973, its distinctive sail-shaped roofs have become synonymous with Australia. The complex houses several performance venues that host opera, ballet, theater, and concerts throughout the year. Visitors can explore the interior through guided tours that reveal the architectural vision and history behind the building. Even simply walking around the harbor promenade offers stunning views and some of the most photographed scenes in Sydney.



Sydney Harbour Bridge

The Sydney Harbour Bridge is another defining landmark of the city and one of the largest steel arch bridges in the world. Completed in 1932, it connects Sydney's central business district with the northern suburbs across the harbor. In addition to being a vital transportation link, the bridge offers spectacular vantage points over the harbor.

Bridge Climb Sydney

Circular Quay

Circular Quay is the lively waterfront at the heart of Sydney's harbor. It serves as the city's main ferry terminal and offers beautiful views of the Sydney Opera House and the Sydney Harbour Bridge. Bondi Beach



Royal Botanic Garden






Federation Square



Brighton Beach



Melbourne Park & Australian Open Precinct

Melbourne Park is one of the world's premier tennis venues and the home of the Australian Open, the first Grand Slam tournament of the year. Located along the banks of the Yarra River just minutes from central Melbourne, the complex transforms every January into a vibrant sporting precinct where players and fans from around the world gather to celebrate the start of the tennis season.

At the center of the complex stands Rod Laver Arena, the tournament's main stadium and one of the most iconic courts in the sport. With a capacity of nearly 15,000 spectators and a retractable roof, it hosts many of the tournament's biggest matches, including the men's and women's singles finals. The arena has been the stage for many historic moments in tennis and remains the focal point of the Australian Open.
