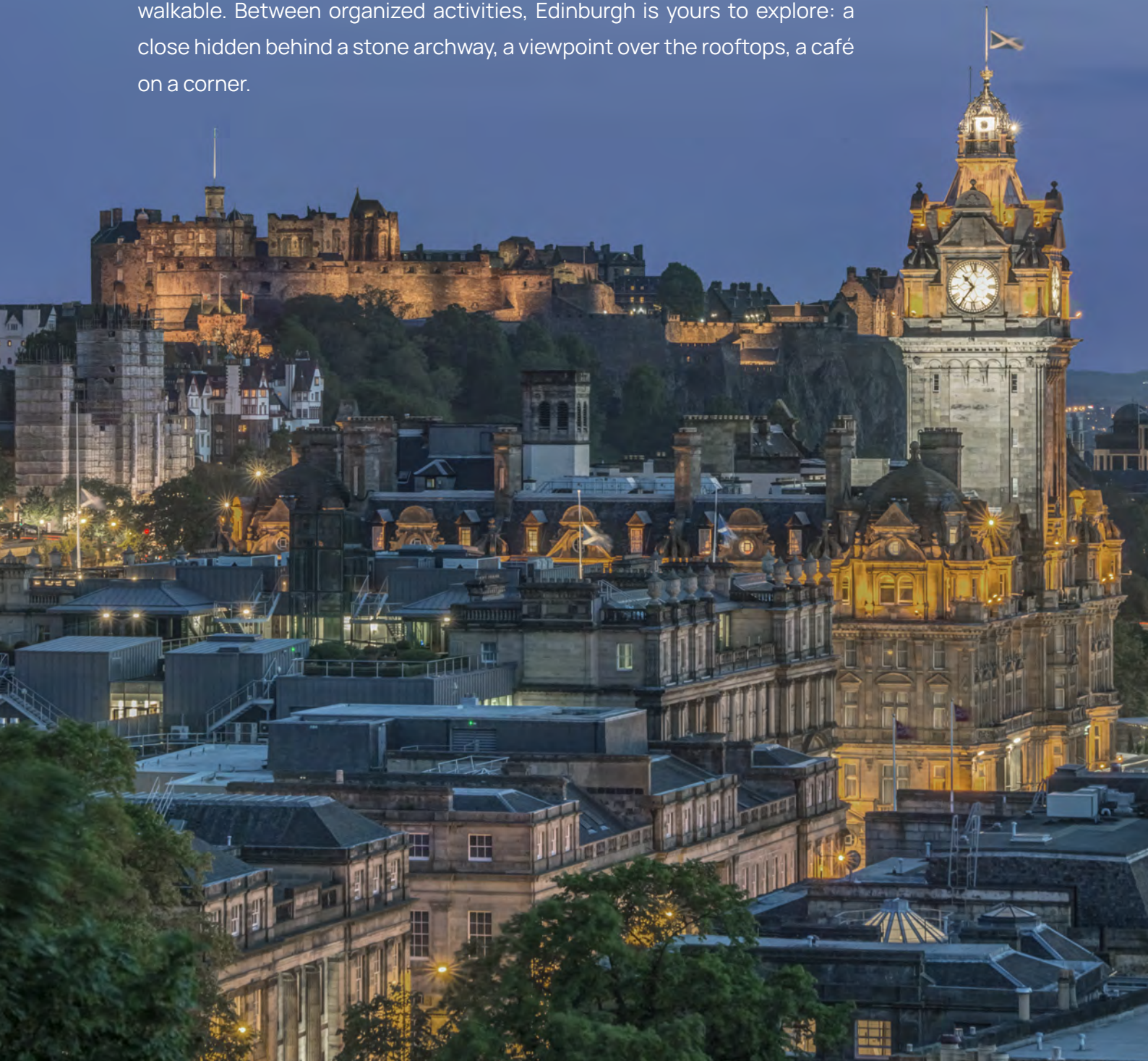

CHAPTER ONE

Edinburgh

Scotland's capital is where the trip begins. A city of two halves — the medieval Old Town and the elegant Georgian New Town, together a UNESCO World Heritage site — layered with history, and endlessly walkable. Between organized activities, Edinburgh is yours to explore: a close hidden behind a stone archway, a viewpoint over the rooftops, a café on a corner.

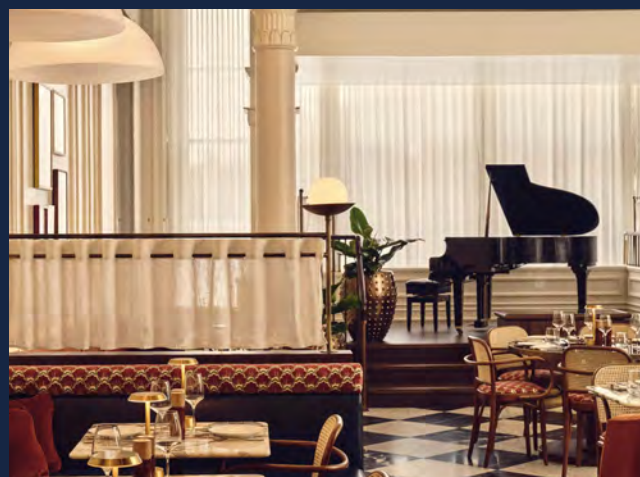
InterContinental

Edinburgh The George



Our home in Edinburgh is the InterContinental Edinburgh The George — a five-star landmark that has stood on George Street, in the heart of the Georgian New Town, since the 18th century. Behind its elegant stone façade, period grandeur meets modern comfort: high ceilings, wide corridors, and rooms set within the original townhouses, alongside the service you'd expect of a five-star.

And the location is unbeatable — a short walk from the castle, the Old Town, and the best of the city's shopping and dining.



SUNDAY JAZZ LUNCH

The trip opens with a stroke of good timing: we arrive on a Sunday, and Sundays at the hotel's restaurant, Le Petit Beefbar, mean the Jazz Lunch, with live musicians on stage. So the group's very first meal, fresh off the plane, unfolds to live jazz.

TENNIS

Tennis on grass at The Grange

Grass is where modern tennis was born — and where few players ever get to play. Founded in 1883, The Grange Club is the only club in Scotland with four grass courts, in the elegant Stockbridge neighbourhood of Edinburgh.

Playing on grass is an experience in itself: the ball skids low and comes through fast, points are short, and the surface rewards touch as much as power.



Across the eight days you'll log more than fifteen hours of tennis, with professional coaches and a ratio of four players to a court. Whatever your level, you'll play and have the chance to sharpen your game. The rest of our tennis sessions take place in the Meadows, the great park in the heart of the city.

EXPLORE

Historic Edinburgh

Edinburgh is a city made for walking, and a private guide takes you into its heart: the Royal Mile running down from the castle through the Old Town, the narrow closes that branch off it, and the stories layered into every stair and hidden corner. The castle stands on an extinct volcano, watching over the city as it has for centuries.



It's also the city where J.K. Rowling wrote much of Harry Potter, and it's scattered with places said to have inspired the wizarding world — the winding, colourful curve of Victoria Street, often linked to Diagon Alley, or Greyfriars Kirkyard, where a weathered headstone reads "Thomas Riddell." You're never quite sure where history ends and legend begins.

One evening is for a traditional Scottish pub: local food, local beer, maybe a dram of whisky, and the warm, lively atmosphere that only a good pub knows how to create.

The Highlands & Loch Ness

The Highlands look like nowhere else you've been. Mountains that fall away in sheer walls, vast empty valleys, a world apart. Glencoe, where the day peaks, is one of the most awe-inspiring valleys in Britain — clouds rolling down the hillsides, the light shifting every few minutes. Few places make you feel so small, and so far from everything.



And then there's Loch Ness. Dark, deep and world-famous, it runs for miles along the Great Glen — over 200 metres deep, and holding more water than every lake in England and Wales combined. We stop at Fort Augustus on its southern shore, where the loch opens out in front of you — home to a certain legendary resident, Nessie, who has kept the world guessing for nearly a century.

SEEN IT BEFORE?

Glencoe might look familiar: this is where Hagrid's hut was built for *Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban*, and these same valleys set the scene for James Bond's *Skyfall*. You'll recognise more than one shot.



ON THE ROAD TO ST ANDREWS

The Birthplace of Scotch Whisky



On the road from Edinburgh to St Andrews, we stop where it all began. Lindores Abbey holds the earliest written record of Scotch whisky anywhere in the world — a 1494 order from King James IV to Friar John Cor to turn malt into aqua vitae, the water of life.

For more than five centuries the stills stood silent; today they run again, and a private tour and tasting take you to the very source of Scotch. As one of the world's most acclaimed whisky writers put it, for the whisky lover this isn't a visit — it's a pilgrimage.

CHAPTER THREE

St Andrews



St Andrews is small, ancient and quietly grand. Its university, founded in 1413, is the oldest in Scotland and the third oldest in the English-speaking world, and its cobbled streets, ruined cathedral and clifftop castle wear their centuries lightly. But above all, this is the home of golf: the game has been played on these links for more than 600 years, and the Old Course sits right at the edge of town, beside the R&A — the club that codified the rules of golf and still governs the game across most of the world. A guided tour shows you it all; and, for those who wish, we'll enjoy an afternoon of golf on the legendary courses of St Andrews.

WHERE WE STAY

Fairmont St Andrews



For the final nights, we move to the Fairmont St Andrews — a five-star resort set on a 520-acre estate high on the cliffs above the North Sea, just outside town. The views run for miles. It has two championship golf courses — the Torrance and the Kittocks — winding across the grounds, while the spa, with its pool, treatment rooms and quiet corners, is made for slowing down.



Dining runs from Italian at La Cucina to Scottish classics at the St Andrews Bar & Grill.

TENNIS

St Andrews Lawn Tennis Club

Tennis in St Andrews is played at the town's Lawn Tennis Club — a historic club founded in 1883, set in leafy Kinburn Park just 500 metres from the famous golf links. Seven courts and a welcoming clubhouse, on grounds that once hosted the Scottish Hardcourt Championship, make it a characterful place to finish the week's tennis.

Harris Tweed Bag

Design and make your own handbag in a hands-on workshop – and not with just any fabric. Harris Tweed is the only cloth in the world protected by an Act of Parliament, handwoven by islanders in the Outer Hebrides to a craft centuries old. You choose the tweed, the straps and the finishing touches, and leave with a one-of-a-kind piece that's entirely yours.

The Outlander Adventure

A full day on the trail of Outlander, in a small group with an expert guide. Stand in the courtyard of Midhope Castle – Jamie's beloved Lallybroch – walk the ramparts of Blackness, and wander Culross, the perfectly preserved 16th-century village that plays Cranesmuir on screen. Along the way: Doune Castle (Castle Leoch to fans, and no stranger to Monty Python and Game of Thrones) and Linlithgow Palace, birthplace of Mary, Queen of Scots.



The East Neuk of Fife

An afternoon along the East Neuk, the string of fishing villages on the Fife coast just beyond St Andrews. Wander the harbour and winding lanes of Crail, one of Scotland's most photographed villages; stroll the seafront at Anstruther; and finish in Pittenweem, still a working fishing port, with galleries and waterfront closes to explore. Salt air, stone harbours, and centuries of maritime history.
